Etobicoke Underwater Club Treasurer's report on the Financial Statements For the year ended September 30, 2021

This past year was the first full year where we implemented both the diving and social memberships. Also, as we were still impacted by Covid 10 restrictions and generally a lower participation by membership, we had very few club dives, which were poorly attended. We did not carry our any other events. Our membership continued to be at an all-time low.

Balance Sheet:

- We closed the year with \$5,223 in the bank (compared to \$3,879 in 2020).
- Accounts receivable: We had \$74 in outstanding receivable at the end of the fiscal year, compare to a \$1,300 balance in the prior year. The balance is owing was collected in early October.
- We have \$11,680 in term deposit, unchanged from the prior year.
- The Prepaid account of \$4,113.76 for the fiscal year ended in 2020 represented deposits made for dive chartered that were cancelled during 2020 because of Covid19. Those deposits have been carried over to the 2021 dive season, utilized and therefore expensed in this fiscal last year.
- Equipment Inventory: we expensed the balance of the inventory value carried on our balance sheet in this fiscal year (\$58). It was determined that whatever is left is mostly virtually of no value, given that club is not currently involved in training activities. The remaining assets will either be sold or disposed of. It is not expected that the club will realize significant cash on any sale. Prior to this fiscal year, the club policy was to carry all items of equipment at a nominal value of \$1.00 per physical asset on hand. No physical inventory was taken of the remaining assets at September 30, 2021.
- Deferred revenues: As result of the club's decision to reimburse members for part of the fees they paid in 2020, we set up a provision of \$2,790 to apply towards members' 2021 membership fees. This amount was reversed and recorded as revenue in the fiscal year.

Statement of revenues and expenses:

- In total, revenues were \$6,883 compared to revenues of \$10,126 in 2020. That we made up of membership renewals of \$3,035, dive revenues of \$3,091 and equipment sales of \$760 (we have now mostly sold or disposed of all our equipment).
- Our Expenses for the fiscal year ended September 30, 2021 were \$8,147 compared to \$9,433 for the fiscal year ended September 30, 2020. The expenses were mostly for dive charters previously paid or committed for in 2020 (\$5,481) but deferred to 2021 due to the pandemic. We also paid \$1,358 to OUC for membership and insurance. The administration costs were for EUC domain name renewal, accounting fees, and miscellaneous expenses.
- Looking at net margins by revenue segment, the only segment that had activity was the summer dives. We lost \$2,390, mostly as we had poor attendance for our August Tobermory weekend,

- no participation for the September dive weekend and little participation for the Georgian Bay dive in late August. As mentioned above, we had already committed or paid for those charters.
- We collected \$3,792 for administrative purposes (\$3,035 for membership and \$760 for sale of equipment) and spent \$2,575 for OUC and other administrative expenses as mentioned above.
 Therefore, we generated a surplus to \$1,216 for our admin sector.
- Consequently, for the fiscal year ended September 30, 2021, we sustained a loss of \$1,264 compared to a gain of \$693 in the prior year, which had generated almost \$3,000 of equipment sales.

-Paula questioned the removal of using the club seal.

No longer a legal requirement and most notifications now are online.

-Paula asked about allowing members with commercial interest into the club.

Discussed potential of an affiliation with a shop. Bruce Beattie had an initial conversation with Dive Academy before Covid hit. Would need to revisit once club is clearer on what it has to offer. Looking at all avenues to rebuild our memberships to help establish wide enough base to provide all we could do before. This commercial interest could also include advertising in Fins. That possibility would happen after clear guidelines for ads was established.

-Paula questioned the security of taking away the requirement of needing majority of members approval for major club expenditures.

This clause was related to equipment and we have none now.

General Discussion

- -Goncalo mentioned his willingness to pitch in where ever he could. He was recognized for all his outstanding contributions with metal works. Dusan commented his table and chairs he won in the raffle were one of his prized possessions.
- -Gary Porcaro asked the executive to hold on for just a bit longer. As a previous member of a club that folded he feel it will only be a short period of time without restrictions for the club to turn things around.
- -A discussion was had about needing everyone to pitch in to break up the tasks and try to spread the work of rebuilding among as many as possible.
